On Capitol Hill, the Coalition has asked for continued support of the Affordable Care Act, legislation to enact effective national Gun Control, the abolishment of the Stand Your Ground Laws in every state, protection of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, the responsible reform of Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid. It is important that our voice is heard at the local and state levels.
